Summer school will be offered in both the elementary and high school buildings.

After school tutoring in math and reading will be offered throughout the school year.

Funds will be provided to update curriculum by purchasing new text books which comes with remediation.

Purchase IXL learning platform that aligns to OAS to assist with learning loss.

3. How the LEA will spend its remaining ARP ESSER funds consistent with the uses authorized in section 2001(e)(2) of the ARP Act.

Graham-Dustin Public schools plans to utilize ARP ESSER III funds to Prepare, Prevent, and/or Respond to the Covid 19 impact on our district. The committee recommends:

Funds to replace old HVAC units with new HVAC with units when and where needed. These new units will increase air quality.

Funds to install air scrubbers in classrooms HVAC to help increase air quality

Funds to buy air purifiers for classrooms

Funds to update student bathrooms as needed.

Funds to update to magnetic keyless locks on exterior doors to allow limit access to buildings where visitors are not able to just walk in.

New security cameras
